



Walking in Massachusetts

Betty's Neck in Lakeville

Special tips for this location: Parking is off Bog Access Road which is off of Long Point Road, Lakeville, MA. Be careful, this road is a dirt road that has lots of treacherous potholes. Drive past the stone with the Betty's Loop sign and drive to the 12-15 car parking lot. From the parking lot, walk to the field and head to the right, where you'll see a big barn and a kiosk—with a very helpful map! Take a picture of this map with your phone and have your all trails app on and wander around!

Highlights of this space: There are great birding possibilities and even a possible sighting of bald eagles. There is access to the Assawompset Pond, which is the largest natural body of freshwater in Massachusetts. Because this land protects clean drinking water, there is no swimming, wading, or paddling allowed at Betty's Neck. Make sure to wander through the fields, woods and stop by the water!

Lace up your hiking boots, if using mosquito and tick spray, spray before heading on the trails, dress in layers, grab a snack and water. Please note that in the wintertime, snowshoeing and cross-country skiing is allowed. Be cautious and wear appropriate gear during hunting season. ENJOY!
