Bloodborne pathogens are infectious microorganisms present in blood or potentially other bodily fluids that can cause disease/s in humans. These pathogens include, but are not limited to, hepatitis B virus (HBV), hepatitis C (HCV), and human immunodeficiency virus (HIV).
