It will cover required school policy definitions, including of Sexual Harassment; what constitutes Notice to Schools/Notice to Parties; Roles of T.IX Coordinator & Team Members; the Grievance Process & Procedures, including due process issues; and Training Mandates.

The workshop will also provide a preview of anticipated upcoming amendments to the regulations.
