

Walking in Massachusetts



Borderland State Park North Easton, MA

Special tips for this location:

A day-use parking fee applies at the 259 Massapoag Ave. main entrance (\$5 for MA residents; \$20 for non-residents). Please do not purchase passes in advance, as parking is first-come, first-served and a pass does not guarantee entry if the lot is full. Check for parking updates before arrival. The park is open daily from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM.

Highlights: The park features a 1910 mansion available for historical tours, as well as trails for hiking, biking, and horseback riding. Visitors can enjoy fishing and boating in the pond and explore the tennis and disc golf facilities. Restrooms are located near the parking lot.

Hike idea: The Pond Walk Trail is a 3-mile loop around Lower Leach Pond. This wide, flat carriage trail is considered the most accessible route for wheelchairs. To start, head to the second parking level behind the restrooms and look for the wide trail near the lodge. Follow the path around the pond to the mansion and back to the parking area.

Please remember to keep your dog on a leash at all times.
