

# Walking in Massachusetts



## Minute Man National Historic Park, Battle Road Lincoln, MA

### Special tips for this location:

Park at 210 North Great Road in Lincoln, look for the brown sign guiding you to the Minute Man Visitor Center. The walking area is open daily, sunrise to sunset. Other parking locations are scattered throughout the Battle Road historic sites if this lot is full.

**Highlights:** The Battle Road trail follows the historic route of the opening battles of the American Revolutionary War winding through forests, fields, and historic sites. The trail is mostly flat with a mix of packed sand and clay which is suitable on most dry days for wheelchairs and carriages. April through October the [Visitor Center](#) is open which has exhibits, a gift shop, maps, and public restrooms. Check out the [events page](#) for guided programs/events and don't miss the yearly reenactment of the American Revolution in April.

**Hike idea:** Start at the trail head and turn left. Meander on this trail as far as you feel suits you. If you have time and energy, walk all the way to Mariam's Corner and then turn back to the car.

Leash up your dog for a walk, but please don't bring them in historic park buildings.
